

Our volunteer pool continues to grow. Several of you said that you would help with set-up and take-down. We seem to be getting most of our volunteers from the Saturday Mass. Come on, Sunday people. Also, we have not yet had anyone under the age of 35 sign up to help! Come on pre-teens, teens, young adults, and young, middle-aged adults. We need your talents, energy and leadership.

We are calling past chairpersons to see if they will offer to chair an event again, but they may be tired of doing it. How about someone with new, fresh, exciting ideas?

Two chair positions that we need to fill quickly are Games and Bingo. Games will start at 11:30 AM Sunday and run to about 5:00 PM. Dear Saint Matthew Community and Visitors:

This Sunday, July 29<sup>th</sup> marks the **Ninth Anniversary** of Saint Mary's Health Clinic at Saint Matthew's.

When the Sisters of Saint Joseph sold Saint Mary's Hospital in Minneapolis they committed the sale price of the hospital to opening neighborhood health clinics and providing local, immediate medical services to uninsured and under-insured persons.

Health care becomes less and less available to individuals without insurance, and the cost of medication is outstripping the budgets of many individuals and families.

For the past nine years each Wednesday afternoon, from 1:00 - 6:00, volunteer doctors and nurses have been available at the Parish Center to see patients.

Saint Matthew's commitment to this effort involves offering the clinic space and utilities. Saint Matthew's receives no rent from the clinic - it is our contribution to help provide health care.

In nine years almost 5,000 patient visits have taken place at "our clinic." Many of the patients are new immigrants, or elderly persons who need help with medications. The clinic will also provide medications to those who have no insurance.

If you wish to use the clinic's services, please call to make an appointment, (651) 690-7029.

My hope is that the clinic will expand and utilize more than one day a week, that a regular pediatrician will soon be available, that the clinic will move more and more to a "drop-in" service along with appointments. All of that must be worked on and negotiated. For the time being, please make an appointment be assured that you are welcomed by our bilingual medical staff.
